Monthly report showed a good addition to reading matter by purchase, gift, and found books, so that the number of volumes is now 15,237. Readers: 6319.

An inventory of books during the past month showed that fewer were lost or missing than in 1935 inventory—the number being 176.

There are 301 children enrolled in the Vacation Reading Club this year, 39 of them being at Frankton. There are 31 gold stars in Elwood now.

No more business being on hand, meeting adjourned until next session.

The Secretary was instructed to write Mr. Clyde a letter of appreciation for his faithful service as a member of the Board of the Elwood Public Library for 16 yrs. and as its Pres. for the past 13 yrs. There being no further business the meeting adjourned.

The Library Trustees meeting November 5th and 6th at Indianapolis was mentioned again and the trustees were recommended to attend.

December 1, 1936

The minutes were read and approved.

The librarian's monthly report was read and placed on file. Total circulation for Elwood was 5183 and for Cranston 848. Thirty five books were added by purchase, one by "finding" and nineteen by binding. Seventy new borrowers were added during the month, forty eight of these being in Elwood and twenty two outside. Rural school circulation showed twenty four adult books and three hundred twenty nine juvenile books in use for the first six weeks period of September and October. Petty cash amounted to twenty dollars and twenty five cents.
