The school cafeteria was transferred into a "dreamland" of red hearts and white crepe paper on February 4 for the first winter formal at S.H.S.

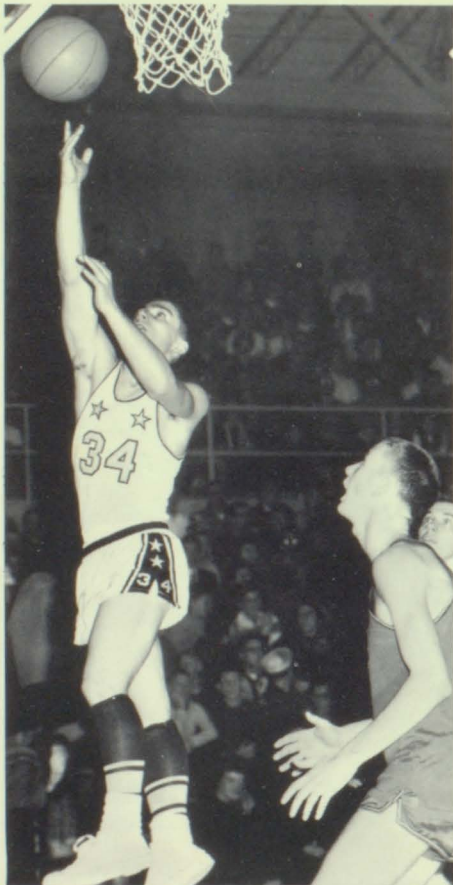
As the couples enjoyed dancing to the music of the Ice Caps, a gay and friendly atmosphere enhanced the evening.
