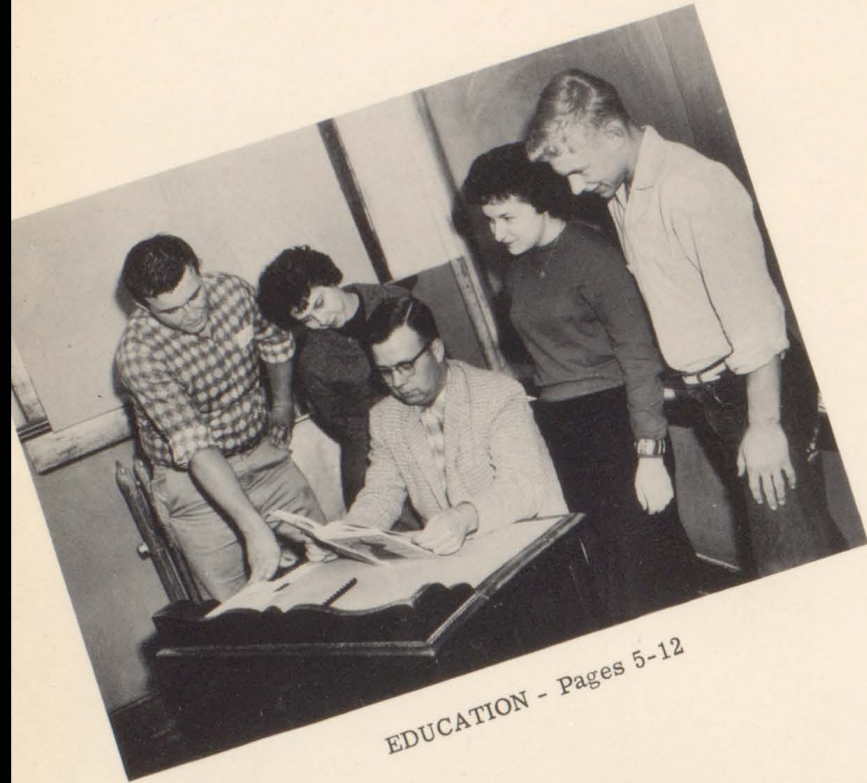
FOREWORD

Class sponsors that year were Mr. Gene Skirvin, Miss Gloria Eller, and Mr. Gene Collins. Two class parties provided entertainment that year. We chose Bonnie Lawson as our Homecoming attendant. Our class plays were "Feudin' Fun", "Party Line", and "Case of the Missing Pearls." We chose powder blue and white as our class colors in order to purchase our class jackets, which we proudly donned around December 1 of that year.

The responsibility of the Junior-Senior Prom was given to us during our Junior year. "My Blue Heaven" was our theme, and the King and Queen of the Prom were Dave Huston and Linda Grindle. The Prom was held at the Kokomo Armory, with Chip McClelland's band providing excellent music. Our class officers during the Junior year were president, Leon Earnest; vice-president, Fred Floyd; secretary, Sandy Street; treasurer, Virginia Stitt; student council, Jon Ribble, Jack Moore, and Larry Horine; social chairmen, Judy Seward and Doug Woollen. Our Homecoming attendant was Pat Monahan. For class sponsors we had Mr. Gene Collins, Miss Linda Scott, and Mr. Douglas Naylor.

Our very successful class play that year

was "The Man Who Came to Dinner," directed by Glenn Crane. We ordered our class rings from Herff-Jones and received them in December. Delegates to Girls' State were Sharon Brewer, Sue Hayes, and Karen Elliott. Their alternates were Judy Seward, Barbara Evans, and Janet Wysong. Delegates to Boys' State were Gordon Gough and Leon Earnest. Their alternates were Jim DuBois and Dean Craun. We also decorated the Tabernacle and served as ushers for the graduating seniors.

When our final year began, our class enrollment had decreased during the previous years from 135, when we were freshmen, to 78, where we stood at the end of the first semester. For Senior class officers we elected president, Jim Stinger; vice-president, Dean Craun; secretary, Bonnie Lawson; treasurer, Pat Monahan; social chairmen, Karen Chapel and Jon Ribble; student council, Leon Earnest and Larry Horine. Our sponsors were Mr. Orville Long, Mrs. Joe Bennett, and Mr. Douglas Naylor. A senior Vesper Service was held December 14 at the Wesleyan Methodist Church. Mr. Paul Horine was the speaker for the well-filled church.

Senior pictures were taken by Gayle Tutterow during the month of July 1960. A class party was held to construct a float for the Homecoming parade. For money-making projects we sold magazines and worked in the Breeze Booth. Thelma Scudi and Karen Elliott received awards for their high salesmanship. Our class play was "Andy Hardy" by Aurania Rouverll. It was presented November 3 and 4, under the direction of Mrs. Adeline Nall. Karen Chapel was our Homecoming Queen and Donna Chidester was senior attendant. Queen candidate for the Valentine Hop was Virginia Stitt, and the outstanding honor of Betty Crocker Homemaker of Tomorrow was won by Lora Nell Spence.

The Seniors took a trip to Chicago from April 14 to 17. We all enjoyed the Prom the Juniors gave on March 30. Baccalaureate Services were held May 14. The following Monday graduation services were held. The speaker was James Huston, a History Professor from Purdue and a Fairmount High School graduate in the class of '35.

As we prepared this annual and wrote of these forthcoming events, we were a class of enthusiastic seniors anticipating the thrill of final graduating activities. Now, as we read about them here, they, too, have become history, and we are no longer students but happy alumni of 1961.

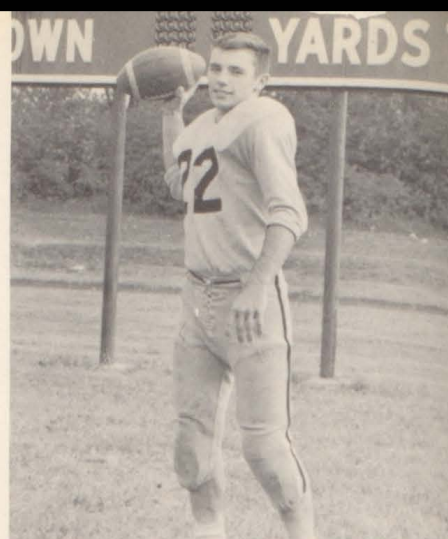




JACK MOORE, Halfback. Particularly effective on defense, Jack loved football and played as if he did. He had a great amount of desire and was a real team player.

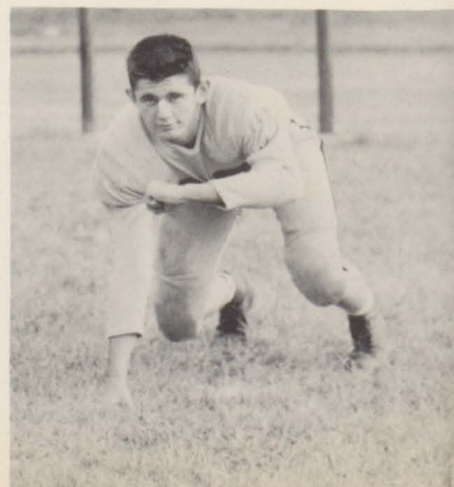
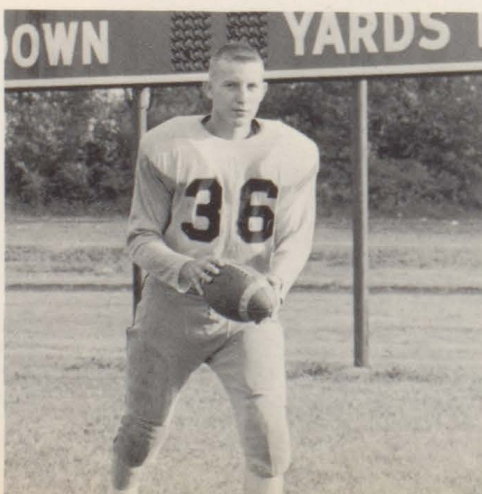

BILL DUMPERT, Guard. Used primarily on offense, Bill's good attitude, competitive spirit and cooperation made him a good team player.

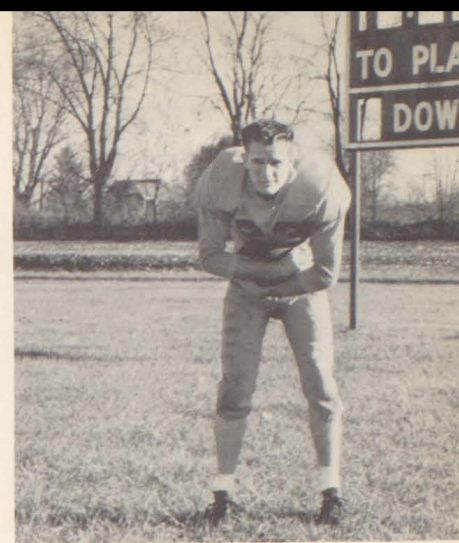
