

Mrs. Dorothy Bennett, Mr. John Roberds, and Mr. Robert Bach, your class sponsors, guided you through the second year of your journey through Fairmount High School.

Your three one-act plays were "If Boys Wore Skirts", "Happy Journey", and "Spreading the News." In January you received navy blue and white class jackets which you proudly wore. Your class parties that year were held at the shelterhouse and at John Hiatt's home. During a fall class meeting you selected Sherri Davis as Homecoming

Queen Attendant.

In the fall of 1960 you began the second half of the journey through F.H.S. In November you received class rings from Herf-Jones. Your social activities consisted of class parties at the shelterhouse and at Salomoni State Park. In March, a very active month, you presented "Rebel Without a Cause," and on March 30 your plans for a successful junior-senior prom came true. Pat Monahan and John Rivers reigned as royalty over the prom held at Honeywell Memorial in Wabash. The Varsitonians from Elwood provided excellent music for "Moments To Remember," the theme of your junior-senior dance.

You selected Brenda Lawson as Homecoming Queen Attendant for the fall Homecoming dance. Your class officers served as ushers for the graduating senior class. Delegates to Girls State were Jean Rivers, Phyllis Winslow, and Sharon Smalley. Alternates were Sue Wood, Carol Morris, and Marilyn Rich. Nile Shields; Vice-President, Charles Casner; Secretary, Jean Rivers; Treasurer, Sherri Davis; Student Council, Ellen Underwood and John Hiatt; and Social Chairmen, Karen Leachman and Ron Hamilton. Class sponsors for your final year were Mrs. Lucile Sicks, Mr. John Roberds, and Mr. Robert Bach.

In the first semester you held the annual magazine drive. Kathy Bussard was high salesman. Dr. David Brown spoke at the Senior Vesper service on December 13 at the Methodist Church. Your class party for that year was held at Sullivan's farm. You selected "Today we learn, tomorrow we lead" as your class motto. Sherri Davis was crowned Homecoming Queen and Carol Morris was senior Homecoming Attendant.

In March you gave "Death Takes a Holiday" as your senior play production. On May 4 the juniors gave you a very nice prom at Honeywell Memorial. The first weekend in

April was very exciting because you, class of 1962, took a trip to Chicago.








Superintendent's Message
