Mr. Paul Davis, assistant principal, previously taught at Frankton High School. He obtained his B.S. degree and M.S. degree from Ball State University.















2nd In Conference


The M-G wrestling team compiled a 2-10 record. The team had several outstanding wrestlers, and lacked only depth for a winning season.


