The question of the selection of a new apprentice to take the place of Josephine Welborn was dismissed, because of lack of funds. Several

names of applicants were presented. Miss Helen Leakey seemed to have preference. The matter of selection was left to the discretion of the Librarian, Miss Snow.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved. Bills amounting to \$429.32 were ordered paid. The Librarian reported 208 books added, making a total of 15174.

Circulation for Edwood was 7410, an increase of 182 — Circulation for Frankton was 1037 — a gain of 199.

Registration of 35 in town and 18 in township making a total of 6426 borrowers.

It was moved and recorded that the library be closed of evenings until September 1933.

The Board sent flowers for the funeral of Mrs. Valdo Canady.

The Vacation Reading Club started with a membership of 95.

In taking the inventory for this yr. 438 books were found missing. Of the 472 that were missing last year, enough were found that reduced the number to 357.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

Dr. Brown reported on the Waiver at the Elwood State Bank.

The librarian read bills amounting to \$465. 13. They were ordered paid.

The monthly report was given, accepted, and placed on file. 74 books and magazines were added during the month and 11 withdrawn. Circulation at Elwood was 5813, a loss of 1984 from last July. Circulation at Frankton was 1846, a loss of 6. 36 new borrowers cards were made during the month in Elwood and 5 for Pipe Creek borrowers. \$11 in fines, \$1 in rental and 25¢ in fees were collected in July. There are now 206 enrolled in the Vacation Reading Club. There are 48 gold stars here. The Western Union messenger made 16 trips for overdue books and collected one.

Miss Snow read Miss Warren's opinion concerning the N. R. A. in regard to libraries. The Board decided to take no action on the code at this time, since it didn't concern professional people.

The proposed budget was then

discussed, but no action could be taken since the valuations had not been received.
